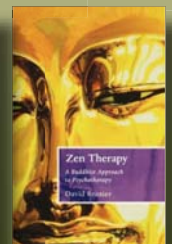
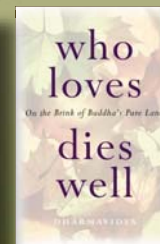
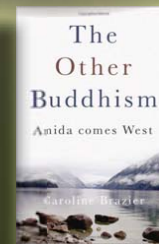
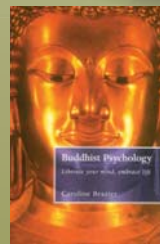
Meditation Poetry Sangha Peace
